2023 COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Health Alliance for the Uninsured (HAU) - \$75,000

The Foundation collaborated with HAU to improve access to specialty care for the uninsured and underserved populations in Oklahoma. HAU helped 488 clients access the healthcare services they need and made 754 referrals for specialty care services.

Eric Baird Spiritual Care International Training/Internship - \$21,000

A training and internship opportunity for chaplains and spiritual care providers in Africa, specifically Burundi, Rwanda, and Democratic Republic of the Congo. A total of 45 people were trained, and nine students participated in an internship at Hope Africa University.

OKC Urban Farms - \$95,000

Leveraging the local farming community in Oklahoma City to create a structure that helps to provide healthy food for the underserved. Farmers work together with charitable clinics in our community to promote healthy eating habits, educate others about sustainable farming practices, and foster a sense of belonging and connection. The Foundation's goal is to serve 240 families per week through six sustainable urban farms.

Christian Clinic Cooperative of Oklahoma - \$35,000

The Christian Clinic Cooperative seeks to empower Christ-centered clinics to improve the health of Oklahomans' body, soul, and spirit. The Foundation hopes to create a sustainable organization that will work with charitable clinics and provide resources to give access to primary healthcare for all underserved in Oklahoma.
