2024 COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Health Alliance for the Uninsured (HAU) - \$75,000

The Foundation continues to collaborate with HAU to improve access to healthcare for the uninsured in Oklahoma. Patient navigation services have been strengthened, specialty care services have expanded, and the overall safety net improved. In 2024, HAU helped about 10,000 clients access healthcare and made 1,073 referrals for specialty care services.

Eric Baird Spiritual Care International Chaplaincy - \$35,000

Groundwork for a postgraduate diploma program in chaplaincy was laid at Kibogora Polytechnic University in Rwanda. Along with the provision of training materials and resources, theology students will begin chaplaincy internships at Kibogora Hospital in January 2025. Furthermore, the first chaplaincy internship in the Democratic Republic of Congo was launched at Nundu Deaconess Hospital in partnership with the Free Methodist Chaplains Association.

OKC Urban Farms - \$75,000

2024 marks the third year of OKC Urban Farms. The project has grown to four farms providing fresh, healthy vegetables to patients at area free clinics. In 2025, the goal is to start two more farms, build tunnels to grow 12 months out of the year, and serve 500 families per week.

Christian Clinic Cooperative of Oklahoma - \$25,000

The Christian Clinic Cooperative of Oklahoma's vision is to foster a movement toward a wholly healthy Oklahoma, by improving the health of Oklahomans' body, mind, and spirit. We continue working together to generate a larger Christian Charitable Clinic presence in Oklahoma City.

Expand Mental Health Access - \$50,000

Accessing mental health services for the uninsured is challenging and often includes long waiting lists. Partnerships with Tulakes Clinic, Southern Nazarene University, The Clinic on the Hill, and Oklahoma Christian University have been established to provide easier access in the Oklahoma City area.
